


A Handy Guide to Databases

Although databases can all look different on the screen, there are four basic techniques that apply to all databases:

Finding an article


Technique 1: Use one OR two keywords (not whole sentences).


Technique 2: If your first search does not work, try some other similar keywords. Keep trying different combinations of keywords.

Technique 3: Try phrase searching by placing a phrase within speech marks.

Technique 4: Use the Boolean operators (AND, OR, NOT) to refine or enhance your search.

Use the limiters (on the left hand side of the screen) such as: Year of publication, language, scholarly peer reviewed journals, major subject headings etc.
