

APA Referencing 7th Edition: A Brief Guide

To create a reference you need to record the details from the source you want to acknowledge:

- **Who** wrote it - author / editor
- **When** was it published – copyright © date for books, publication date for journals
- **What** is it - title of work
- **Where** is it from
 - For a **book** Publisher(s), DOI or URL (if the book has this)
 - For an **article** *Journal name, volume* (issue), pages, DOI (if the article has this)
 - For a **website** <http://www.here.com>
